#### Best, Clouser, Engle top the bill at 2013's Midwest Fly Fishing Expo

If you give your all to your fly fishing and fly tying, you've got a chance to learn from the best at the 2013 Midwest Fly Fishing Expo, March 9 and 10 at the Macomb Community College Sports and Expo Center in Warren, MI.

"When we say the best, we mean that quite literally as internationally renowned fly tyer and angler A.K. Best is one of our five headliners," said Expo Chairman Joe Sprys. "Not only do we have A.K. coming back to town, we also have Bob Clouser and Ed Engle, both of whom have helped headline our show in the past." Rounding out the Expo's five headliners are newcomers Jeff Currier and Michael Mauri, who give this year's show a truly international flair.

Presented annually by the Michigan Fly Fishing Club (MFFC), the Expo features more than 120 of the biggest names in equipment dealers; rod builders and net makers; outfitters and guides; fly tyers; artists and authors; canoe, kayak and drift boat manufacturers; and conservation organizations, all specializing in one or more of the many facets of fly fishing.

The Expo features dozens of free seminars about fly fishing techniques, fly tying and fly fishing destinations. Children, teens and the young at heart will get an opportunity to tie their first flies at a special fly tying area with instruction provided by MFFC volunteers. A 100-foot casting pond provides ample room for Expo attendees to test new fly rod offerings from an array of rod makers.

"Every year since 1979 the Michigan Fly Fishing Club has spotlighted some of the biggest names in the world of fly fishing, giving anglers from Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, Ontario and beyond an opportunity to hear and see firsthand from the best our sport has to offer," said MFFC President Chris Hunter. "This year," he said, "is no exception. Where else are you going to be able to interact with anglers who have fly patterns named after them? I'm thinking, of course, of someone like Bob Clouser, whose 'Clouser' patterns have caught fish across the United States and around the world. Where else will you be able to get up close and personal with the first U.S. competitor to medal in an international fly fishing competition?" That would be Jeff Currier.


Expo hours are 9 a.m.-6 p.m. on Saturday, March 9, and 10 a.m.-4 p.m. on Sunday, March 10, at the Macomb Community College Sports and Expo Center at 14500 E. 12 Mile Road in Warren, MI. Admission is \$10 for adults. Children and teens age 16 and under are admitted free.

Two-day passes can be purchased for \$15. Parking is free. The club's web site is www.mffc.org.

The Expo is the MFFC's only fund-raising event. The proceeds from the Expo help fund the club's education and conservation activities. Since the Expo's inception, the MFFC has directed more than \$425,000 to conservation efforts on such blue ribbon trout streams as the Au Sable, Manistee, Pere Marquette and Boardman as well as the Huron and Clinton rivers and Paint Creek in southeast Michigan.

The Michigan Fly Fishing Club is home to roughly 400 members and is based in Livonia, MI, although its members hail from across the state and several other states. It has been honored by former Gov. Jennifer Granholm, the International Federation of Fly Fishers (IFFF) and the Michigan United Conservation Clubs as their "Club of the Year."

#### Headliner background



**A.K. Best**: A prolific fly tyer, author and lecturer, Best arguably is nearly as well known for his exploits with author John Gierach, who has chronicled those adventures in a series of essays and books over the past two decades. Best is the author of "Production Fly Tying," "Dyeing and Bleaching Natural Fly-Tying Materials," "A. K.'s Fly Box," "Advanced Fly Tying," "Fly Fishing with A. K.," and "Fly Tying with A. K." He also is a regular contributor to *Fly Tyer* magazine, *Fly Rod & Reel* magazine and *Mid-Atlantic Fly Fishing Guide*.



**Bob Clouser**: His is a name that is known to fly anglers the world over. His classic pattern, the Clouser Minnow, is claimed to be the most effective underwater fly ever developed and rated as America's #1 fly by *Field & Stream* magazine. He has been presented numerous awards honoring his commitment to conservation, especially work done to enhance smallmouth bass fishing in his home state of Pennsylvania. Most notable among his awards are his induction into the national Fresh Water Fishing Hall of Fame as a Legendary Angler and the E. Henshall Award presented by the International Federation of Fly Fishers to honor his warm water conservation and angling activities. He was named Angler of the Year in 2000 by *Fly Rod & Reel* magazine.



**Ed Engle:** Nearly as prolific a writer as fellow Coloradan A.K. Best, Ed Engle calls the South Platte River his home water. His fly fishing articles have appeared regularly in newspapers and magazines for more than 30 years. He is a regular contributor to *American Angler, The Boulder Daily Camera,* and *Gray's Sporting Journal,* and also has been published in *Fly Fisherman, Fly Rod & Reel, Flyfishing & Tying Journal, Trout* magazine, *Fly Tyer, Sports Afield,* and *Saltwater Fly Fishing.* He is the author of five books: "Trout Lessons," which offers advice for what to do when your usual fly fishing solutions aren't working; "Tying Small Flies" and "Fishing Small Flies;" "Splitting Cane," which chronicles the life and craftsmanship of 16 bamboo rod makers; and "Fly Fishing the Tailwaters," a groundbreaking treatise about fishing the waters below dams.



Jeff Currier: When he's not flying off on another globetrotting fly angling expedition, Currier resides in Victor, Idaho with his wife Yvonne. Perhaps his most recognized achievement was in leading Team USA to its first ever top-10 finish in the World Flyfishing Championships in Spain. During the competition, Currier managed to fool fish in every venue placing third in the individual standings, becoming the only American ever to take home a medal in the 28-year history of the competition. He has escorted fly fishers on expeditions across six continents angling for species ranging from peacock bass, tarpon, Nile perch, permit, tigerfish, trevally and taimen. An International Game Fish Association (IGFA) record holder, Currier has fished in more than 40 countries and caught over 275 species of fish on the fly. You may have seen him or heard his commentary on TV and radio on such programs as "Fishing the West." "Fly

Fishing the World," "In Search of Fly Water," "Reel Adventures," "Fly Fish TV," and "Ask About Fly Fishing Internet Radio."



**Michael Mauri:** Bringing additional international flavor to the 2013 Expo is another newcomer, Michael Mauri. This German native caught his first trout at age six in a small stream in Bavaria. Among his early, influential sources of inspiration were Lefty Kreh and international casting champion Steve Rajeff. A true student of casting technique, he created his own unique casting style, which he calls EFCT, short for Effective Fly Casting Technique. The secret of this style, he explained, is the caster's natural movement, which makes it easy to learn – for everybody. As a professional fly angler, Mauri has guided across western Europe from Italy north to Norway.

WHERE: HURON RIVER: THE YURT AT THE WALLED LAKE OUTDOOR EDUCATION CENTER

The Trout Tune Up is an annual gathering of MFFC members on the first weekend of April at the Walled Lake Outdoor Education Center in Commerce Township. The Club rents a structure called the Yurt for the day and provides food, beverages and a place to warm up, if it happens to be a cold day.

A Yurt is a semi-permanent structure which was used by the Mongolian Nomads. It is the Asian version of a tepee. The Lowe's Yurt is 30 feet in diameter and built on a 36x50 foot deck. It can hold up to 50 people at one time.

We fish the Huron River, which will have been recently been stocked by the DNR with trout from a nearby hatchery. The DNR will usually plant 2000 to 3000 Brown and Rainbow trout between the Moss Lake dam and Wixom Road Bridge. Special trout regulations (flies only) are in effect for that stretch from the 1st thru the end of the month of April.







Sometimes, if we're lucky, the DNR will have released some of their "breeder stock". These fish are usually very large and very strong. Catching one of these guys can sometimes be one of the largest fish you catch all year.

All our club members are encouraged to attend and are welcome to come to the Yurt anytime throughout the day between the hours of 9 am and 5 pm.

This outing also makes for a good time to test out new equipment you may have acquired at the Expo, over over the Holidays or after last trout season ended.

Hope to see you there and don't forget your fishing license.
