Alan "Al" Ritt grew up here in Michigan where his passion for fishing was born. He started tying in the early 80's. In 1989 he moved to Northern Front Range of Colorado (Longmont) where he and his wife Diana reside. He is currently on the pro-staff of Whiting Farms, PEAK Fishing, Flymen Fishing Company, Performance Flies, Tubeology, Diiachi Hooks, and a fly designer for Montana Fly Company. Jerry Regan is a third generation fly tyer, and one of the true keepers of Michigan's fly fishing history. He is one of the best commercial fly tiers in the business. As a kid he learned fly tying and fishing from Michigan's genuine legends like Earl Madsen and Ernie Borche. One unique trait of Jerry's patterns is that he continues to use the original materials, and avoids using the synthetics which have flooded the market place. Jerry will be demonstrating the flies of the Classic Au Sable fly patterns.

Jason Haddix moved to Colorado with his family as a teenager, and soon took up fly fishing and tying. He is an experienced veteran guide who enjoys taking clients into Colorado's Front Range and the beautiful, productive waters of southern Wyoming. When he's not guiding, he spends time designing and developing new flies as well as making modifications to old ones. Jason owns and operates his cwn tying business, Waters Edge Fly Tying Company. Not only are Jason's flies extremely productive, but because of the processes he uses, they are also very durable. Wayne's specialty remains deer hair bugs and hair work in general. His is also known for his epoxy flies, saltwater flies, and classic Atlantic salmon flies. Steve Wascher caught his first Trout at the age of three and a half, on a DRY FLY!! In addition to tying, Steve guides during the summer months and writes articles which have appeared along with his flies in Hatches Magazine, American Angler, and Mid-Atlantic Fly Fishing Guide. Steve will be tying his famed deer hair bugs and tube flies.

Eli Berant grew up and lives in Michigan. He was surrounded by big water all his life. He tied his first fly at the age of 15, and ever since, fly fishing and fly tying have been a passion ever since. Steve has adapted concepts from fishing huge saltwater flies and applied them to the big waters in Michigan. Eric Austin grew up tying and fishing Catskill dry flies in the Adirondack Mountain region of New York State. In his youth, Eric loved "classic" fly fishing books authored by the likes of Preston Jennings, Ray Bergman, Al McLane, J.Edson Leonard and George La Branche. This love of history led to a column at flyanglersonline.com called "Just Old Flies." Each week Eric would provide a recipe, photograph, and history of a classic pattern. The Just Old Flies column blossomed, including historical flies by American classic tiers and the old masters of the U.K., including salmon flies found in Kelson, Francis Francis, and Pryce Tannatt. Eric was featured in the series of books published in London, "Fly Tiers of the World." His Red Quill was recently selected to be on the cover of the re-release of Earnest Schwiebert's classic "Matching the Hatch." His influences include the Irish wet flies of Alice Conba, Rene Harrop's flies for the Henry's Fork, Carrie Stevens' streamers, the quill body flies of A.K.Best, and the dry flies of Francis Betters. Oscar Feliu, a native of Chile, came to the United States in 1969. Here in the states be became a master fly fisher and fly tyer. As a student in Michigan, he conducted aquatic studies in several of the states' rivers. His innovative fly patterns became well known throughout the Great Lakes region and were the subject of several newspaper and magazine articles. These publications include: Lansing State Journal, FFF Magazine, Trout Canada, "Fly-fishing Magazine", Scientific Anglers Quarterly, American Angler, Field & Stream, Fly-fish America, Michigan Out-Of-Doors.

As a musician, Oscar has traveled the world entertaining countless people. His repertoire ranges from operatic arias such as Granada, to pop classics from the likes of Elvis and Johnny Mathis. He has recorded a number of CDs, which have received critical acclaim.



Fisherman, educator, author, and conservationist, **Joe Humphreys** demonstrated his passion for angling, water, and wildlife throughout his life long career as a fly fisherman. Fortunately for us, Mr. Humphreys enjoys sharing his knowledge and skills.

He authored two highly acclaimed books, Joe Humphreys Trout Tactics and On the Trout Stream with Joe Humphreys, plus many articles in regional and national periodicals. He also hosted a nationally broadcasted fly fishing series on ESPN, been featured on three fly fishing videos (The Fly Fishing Series), and produced and featured on four videos.

Mr. Humphreys taught fly fishing for more than forty years, including directing Penn State's angling program for nineteen years. Some high-profile pupils include former President Jimmy Carter, former Vice President Richard Cheney, and basketball coach Bobby Knight. He currently teaches a weekend fly fishing course at the impressive Yellow Breeches Creek in Boiling Springs, Pennsylvania, hosted by Allenberry Resort located directly on the creek.



Rick Kustich is a fly fishing author and photographer. In January 2013, he released *Advanced Fly Fishing* for Great Lakes Steelhead, his fifth fly fishing title. Rick's work appeared in numerous national and regional publications. He is also a fly tyer, seminar speaker, travel host, and produced a fly tying DVD. Rick spent time as a fly shop owner, outfitter, and fly fishing book publisher.

Rick began fly fishing almost forty years ago on the lakes and streams of upstate New York. He has since traveled extensively experiencing the finest fly fishing throughout North America and beyond, but continues to find that some of the best fishing often exists in your own backyard. Rick spends a significant amount of time each year on the water, and has developed a special passion for steelhead fishing in the Great Lakes and British Columbia.



Landon Mayer is a fly fishing guide in the Florissan, CO area, in the South Platte River area where he has guided for fifteen years. He also served as a guide in Alaska for a year. Passion and love of fly fishing is what motivates him. His specialty is catching large trout with small flies using lightweight rods. Landon also teaches. Through trial, error, and perseverance, he has developed innovative techniques for hunting trout.
