### Take me to the Bahamas! They're close, convenient and can be inexpensive

Founding member and saltwater fishing aficionado John Pinto took Michigan Fly Fishing Club members on an impromptu tour of the Bahamas on December 1. It was appropriate as metro Detroit had its first taste of winter temperatures only days before.

Members who know Pinto (virtually everyone, right?) could not have been surprised by a set of remarks liberally laced with stories of past club members' adventures and observations as they plied the salt pursuing tarpon, permit and especially bonefish. One example: "You're right. They don't use (a) size 14 Adams down here."

While the bulk of his comments were reserved for bonefish -- the "ghosts of the flats" -- Pinto offered his opinions concerning the other "Saltwater Slam" fish -- tarpon and permit.



Tarpon: "You've all seen big tarpon on TV. Big fish. Big jumps. Fishing with 12-weights. I've done the big tarpon thing. I don't like it. It got boring," Pinto said. The boredom wasn't from catching the big boys; it was from hunting them. The angler spends hours looking with only a limited number of chances to cast. He said some fly anglers are beginning to look at smaller tarpon -- 15- to 30-pounders. Fish that you can use a 10-weight on. Cuba and Nicaragua offer opportunities for this fishery, he said.

Permit: "The people who fish for permit are a sick and twisted lot. They look like they're the bluegill of the ocean. I know one angler who's fished for them for years and has landed two. I don't fish for them and I've landed one."

Pinto's unreserved passion is for bonefish and one of the top destinations for fly anglers who share that fever for bones. "Bonefish are the teenage girls of the fish world. They've got an attitude that you won't believe," Pinto said. That and the fact that once hooked a bonefish will take you into your backing in the blink of an eye.

## MFFC's 2011 Public School now accepting enrollments


Students are needed to make the April 16 Public School a success! We will be offering **three class segments** over a full day of instruction at a location in the greater metropolitan area yet to be determined.

The first segment will be Equipment, Knots and Stuff where we: overview basic equipment you will need to spend a day in the stream and how it is put together; knots for connecting system components (backing, line, leader, tippet, fly); general accessories or "stuff" to complement your streamside activities. Segment two will address Michigan Entomology or "bugs," basic fly tying equipment, material and learning to tie a few flies. Casting is the third segment where we cover the grip, stance, form and posture, rod plane and loop development; basic components of a standard pick-up-and-lay-down cast, false cast, roll cast, wiggle cast, and off-shoulder cast. Also we will review practice techniques and talk some about troubleshooting some common casting problems.

MFFC provides all equipment and materials and food. Students, you just need to sign up and plan on spending the day with our experienced fly fishers, each instructing in their areas of interest. Cost is \$50 for adults and \$15 for those under 18 with a paid adult.

He took members on a whirlwind tour of both the Bahamas and the history of fly anglers' pursuit of these spooky, speedy fish. The tour started with the northern Bahamas -- Bimini, Grand Bahama and Abaco, the three Bahamian islands where fly anglers first flocked to target bonefish -- and ended with the southern-most "out islands" that he favors.

He offered a bit of advice about the northern islands. "A cold front that hits Florida is going to hit the northern islands. That's going to put fishing off" for several days.

The focus on the central Bahamas fell on Andros, the biggest island of the archipelago. "It's billed as the Bonefish Capital of the World." Apparently with good reason as Pinto recounted a time when he and a fellow club member, Joe Stefani, hooked 18 bones, landing 16, in 3 1/2 hours. Andros was also home and home base to guide Charlie Smith, the reputed originator of the Crazy Charlie fly pattern, now a staple in every bonefish angler's fly box.

The other central islands include Little San Salvador and, the Exumas. "Great Exuma took off in the 1970s," Pinto said, recounting the tale of noted Exuman guide Tracy Ganes, who reportedly died on his 93rd birthday while poling a flats boat with a client.

From there it was on to the southern Bahamas -- Acklins Island, Crooked Island and Mayaguana.

Mayaguana, of course, is Pinto's personal favorite, as he has conveyed groups of MFFC members to the island for a number of the 11 years that he's made it his favorite destination.

His plan is to do it again in the new year. "We're looking at sometime in the October-November time frame" he said. Why? "The wind doesn't blow," he said.

Casting accurately into range of hyperspooky bonefish in the midst of perpetual winds doesn't always make for a rewarding experience. That's why Mayaguana at that time of year is the best place to learn to bonefish.

## 2011's first Featured Tier: Todd Schotts

Welcome 2011! I'll be kicking off the New Year as "Featured Tier."

I grew up on the west side of the state ... the Fremont area on a private lake with an excellent fishery. I was close to the White River, minutes from the Muskegon River, and a little ways off were the Pere Marquette and Grand Rivers.

I moved over to the Detroit area about 23 years ago and now reside in Lansing. I joined the club about 10 years ago when I got into fly tying. I started fly tying before fly fishing. My first adventure for fly fishing was on a lake, using a glass fly rod and foam spiders for panfish. The only fly fishing I ever saw was with Glen Blackwood on TV.

I went to Ferris State and served in the Marine Corps as an Assault Gunner and Forward Observer; plus working in EOD (Explosive Ordinance Division).

With my enthusiasm for fly tying I have helped with various events tying with kids, our schools, and traveling around the Midwest and even down South, tying at various shows.

I will be demonstrating the "Mr. Fabulous" Bead Head Nymph mentioned back in *The Evening Hatch* in November 2010. It was the fly I used on the 2010 Trout Opener. The "Shake & Bake" Hex Emerger is also a newer pattern. I have had great luck using this fly during the Huron River's famed Hex hatch and while steelheading this past spring.

So bring your vise, your tools, and we'll have some fun tying these two patterns.

# "Mr Fabulous" Bead Head Nymph

Hook: TMC 200R, Dai Riki 270, or 1270 Daiichi, Size 14 & 12

**Thread:** 6/0 or 140 denier tan or brown

Weight: .25 or .35 tied on 1 side as with the Drunken Sailor fly

Tail: Pearl Flash (hook gap length)Rib: Red Wire (medium size)Body: Hareline Ice Dub Hares Ear

**Collar:** Angora goat dubbing – hot orange or fire orange **Hackle:** Soft Hackle Hungarian Partridge (optional)

(shown with optional hackle collar)

**Head:** Gold bead head – regular, tungsten, or glass



## "Shake & Bake" Hex Emerger

Hook: Size 8 or 10 Natural Curved Hook

(TMC 200R, Dai Riki 270)

Thread: 6/0 or 140 Denier Lt. Yellow

**Tail:** 3 Emu herl tips – Natural (pulled up for shell back)

Rib: Yellow fine

Abdomen: Pale yellow dubbing

Shell Back: Emu herl

Wing Case: 1 mm or 2 mm white closed-cell foam Thorax: Golden Stone Angora Goat dubbing

Legs: Silicone legs (pumpkin color)
Eyes: Medium black mono (optional)
