After that outing I approached Joe Sprys, who was president at the time, and asked if I could resurrect the outing. After the first year, the attendance almost doubled. Then it hit 15 members, even though the weather could be a tad unpredictable. We experienced sun, fog, rain, and high winds all in the space of two days. Then participation jumped to 20 members and then 23. This year we had 32 participants. To everyone's benefit the weather was so much in our favor. With the exception of a few fog patches, the sun was out in force most of the time.

So were the Smallies.

We had never before seen beds as huge as the bronzebacks of Eagle Bay were making.

I tried to get a photo of what it looked like, so you could actually see, but unfortunately I was unable to due to the glare of the sun on the water; oh that that sun.

The smallmouth went from "pre-spawn" to "spawn," and then into "post-spawn" during our outing. With all these fish working the beds, we also saw a few Gar Pike. They looked like broomsticks swimming around. We later found out that the Gar Pike were really interested in the eggs on the beds. I think on Sunday we played the role of bouncers, chasing the Gar Pike away from beds and eggs. We know that Mother Nature has her ways of doing things like this, but we wanted the Smallies to have a chance.

Among all that action, we actually caught some fish. The count totaled more than 200 bronzebacks. The average size ranged from 13 to 16 inches with a few in 18-inch range and one stretching the tape at 21 inches.

New Board member Bruce Strachan ended up landing two roughly 27-inch carp.

This had to be one of the most memorable outings in a long time. We had quality fish, nice weather, and great participation. For the first time since I have been going up to the Port Austin area, we actually got to have a bonfire on Saturday night. It was mighty relaxing after a hard day of fishing.


