

Outdoors: Fly fishing show offers instruction, education, information

The oldest and largest fly fishing show held east of the Mississippi River will be staged at the Macomb Community College Sports and Expo Center in Warren, Mich., next month.

The Midwest Fly Fishing Expo, now in its 46th year, takes place March 11 and 12.

A collection of expert fly tyers, casters, instructors, guides, and industry representatives will be part of the show, which will feature a number of demonstrations and a veritable fly fishing academy.

"We are so excited to be able to again hold this event," Sybil Hunter, president of the host Michigan Fly Fishing Club, said. "We pride ourselves on bringing to Greater Detroit some of the most talented individuals in this sport."

The lengthy list of guest speakers and tyers includes George Daniel, Landon Mayer, Tim Flagler, Jake Villwock, and Eric Nagusky.

"We're especially pleased because this year's headliners will appeal to a broader angling audience," Hunter said. "Each excels in their own way in helping their fellow anglers become better, which adds to the enjoyment in this sport."


The show promises to showcase dozens of free seminars about fly fishing techniques, fly tying and fly-fishing destinations, while also bringing together the rod builders, artists, outfitters, and conservation groups that are so vital to the sport of fly fishing.
