

# Isle Royal: Michigan's only National Park




Author and MFFC member Jim DuFresne will give a presentation about Isle Royale National Park at the speaker meeting on January 8th at Clarenceville Middle School.

Jim is the author of more than 20 books, including 12 Classic Trout Streams in Michigan but is best known for his guidebook to Michigan's only national park. In his presentation, he explores the intriguing history of the 210-square-mile park and the most popular ways people experience the backcountry of this roadless wilderness in Lake Superior.

Isle Royale National Park: Foot Trails & Water Routes was first released in 1983 as the only guidebook devoted to hiking/paddling an area in Michigan. Often referred to as the Backpacker's Bible at the park, the guidebook celebrated its 40th year of continuous publication last summer.

Jim is also the long-time author of Lonely Planets' Alaska travel guidebook, and its Hiking In Alaska guide and last year spoke about Katmai National Park. He served as the Production Editor for Evening Hatch from 2020 to 2024 and a frequent contributor to its pages.

About Glenn, owner of Glenn River Fly Co: mentored by Chris Helm (who is regarded by most to be the finest deer hair fly-tier); grew up in the limestone creeks of PA; his "Give Back" attributes to his teaching (classroom or riverbank) skills to beginners and children

- Midges: two basic types: diptera (2 winded flies like the house fly, horse fly, mosquito) and chironomids (midges are small slender body with antennae, prominent part of the trout diet and has multi-breeding periods during the year
- Resources on midges include: Ed Engle, Pat Dorsey, Craig Matthews (to name a few speakers from our past Expos)
- Life Cycle:
  - metamorphosis larva (long strands / worm like); pupa (short & squatty, with a thorax, has gas bubble floats to the top, can be found in low/high/dirty water; adult (shucks on the water and hoovers above the water)
  - o colors: black/brown/cream/red
  - segmentation: curved back (movement below surface);
     suspending flies with soft hackles
- Trout Tendencies: sizes #16 #20; rise form / air bubbles / bulges / sipping / opportunistic vs selective
- Fly Fishing Techniques: hand twist / <u>Leistering Lift</u> / float fishing / dredging
- Gear / Tools: grease leader / dry dropper (15" tag) / 2 dry flies / slinky (curly) tippet / flouro-carbon 5X 6.5X

# Michigan Fly Fishing Club Yellowstone Trips for 2025 Submitted by Al Haxton

Its almost time for sign up for the Michigan Fly Fishing Club annual trip to Yellowstone Park for 2025.

For 2025 we again will be staying at Driftwaters Resort, located in a Madison valley just downstream from the \$3 Dollar Bridge. We have stayed there many times before and I feel it's a truly wonderful place. We have 3 weeks again starting Saturday July 26 to August 2, then August 2 to August 9 and finally August 9 to August 16, 2025.

Imagine, being right in the center of the Yellowstone area fly fishing. Within a couple hours of our lodge are more than 2000 miles of trout streams. There are also hundreds of lakes and ponds that are open to fishing too. And don't even think about the vast number of species that are available. Not only Brook, but Rainbow, Brown and Cutthroat trout, and also the wonderful Grayling. There are streams that are a few steps from your car, streams that are a mile hike from the car and areas that best accessed by a horse back ride. And all this within a short drive from our lodge. The names of the rivers available reads like a travel-log of where to fish in every fly fishers top ten list. Not only the numerous rivers inside Yellowstone Park itself, but hundreds of streams outside the park will beckon you to try them. This trip truly is one of those trips that will make you upset to have to choose from so very many opportunities.



This will be our 23rd year and in truth while I have been on every trip I have only scratched the surface of the opportunities on places to fish. From dry flies to nymphs, streamers to soft hackles, this trip offers places for just about every kind of fishing, for every kind of trout that is imaginable.

The budget this year is not set yet. That budget, when set, includes room and board for the entire week of our stay. The budget will include 6 dinners each week, Saturday to Tuesday and then Thursday and Friday. No dinner is provided on Wednesday night because our tradition is to drive over to Cooke City to fish the Lamar River, Soda Butte and Slough Creek. Hotel reservations are set for the night in Cooke City but are not included in the budget. You do not have to visit Cooke City but.

no dinner is provided. As before breakfast and lunch items will be in your cabin when you arrive on Saturday. I send out a shopping list to each person on the trip and use that to provide items that you want for those meals. Each cabin also will have a cooler for your use and bear spray for each person in the cabin



Folks normally fly into Bozeman airport, BZN, rent a car and drive to Driftwaters. I suggest if you plan to attend that you rent a car early because rates go up the closer to summer it gets. In fact our car is already set for next year. Try to arrive at BZN about 11 AM so your drive to Driftwaters goes well with time in case of delays.

Sign up this year will be the day of the first meeting of December. No deposit is needed at that time. So send me an email if you are interested. As always, its first come first served and this trip fills up very fast. This year with three weeks available we have three times the room but don't wait, there are lots of folks already talking about the trip.

## Alaska Trip Summary

As a freshwater fly fisherman or woman searching for locations to fish, Alaska is almost always on the list.

I have been fortunate the last three years (2025 will be my fourth) to walk-watershed the Situk River on the island of Yakutat, Alaska located northwest of Juneau, southeast of Anchorage and reachable only by plane or boat.



Our self-guided trip during the last few days of July and the first week of August targets Pink Salmon because they are plentiful and the river is much, much less crowded. Any streamer fly can be used as long as it is PINK! Rods in our group range from an 11' 4wt, to a 10' 6wt, to a 9' 7-8wt.

Weather is generally in the mid 50's to mid 60's and with opportunities for rain. In addition to shing the river opportunities exist for sight-seeing flights, hiking to a glacier-fed lake with icebergs and an ocean charter for Halibut, Sea Bass, Salmon, etc.



Wildlife include deer, moose, bald eagles, river otters and bears, both black, brown and grizzly although none have been encountered while fishing in the river. Typically, six anglers share a cabin with rooms also available at Leonard's Landing Lodge (www.LeonardsLanding.com). Meals are enjoyed at the cabin with individuals preparing their own breakfast, sandwiches, fruit and drinks on the river for lunch and rotated dinner preparation. Occasionally we go out for dinner. Kitchen cleanup is informally rotated as well. Food is purchased from either of two grocery stores on the island. Transportation to and from the river is by rental van.

For the past three years the total trip cost including air fare, lodging, food and transportation has been about \$3,000. This includes an overnight, usually in Seattle, going to and from Yakutat. Of course, this cost does not include an ocean charter shing, a sightseeing flight or up to 50 pounds of cleaned, frozen and shipped salmon.

t's been an incredible two years!

Since our first event two years ago we have managed 166 stewardship projects across 12 Mid-Michigan communities. We have mobilized over 2,100 volunteers, retrieved nearly 135,000 pounds of litter, trash, and other debris from our waterways and adjoining greenways, and conducted several park beautification projects. We have given back to our communities, in the value of our volunteer services alone, an estimated \$420,000.

We love seeing the growing enthusiasm and offers of support We are particularly pleased about the growing interest and support from our student populations, with recent volunteers coming from: Michigan State University, Western Michigan University, Okemos High School, and East Lansing High School.

Our Top 2024 Volunteer Organization was a student organization; MSU's Crew Club. They created impact on and along our Grand River, at Lansing's Cherry Hill Park and Kruger's Landing.
